## New, "Low Impact" Fund Raiser Planned

Your board of directors has approved a new fund raiser, with the potential to provide a continuing source of income for our service fund, with very little ongoing effort, after the initial start-up phase.

We will be collecting used printer and copier ink and toner cartridges. Many businesses and individuals use these items and throw them in the trash, because they don't know how to recycle them. Kiwanis would provide a valuable recycling service for these environmentally unfriendly items, while making money at the same time.

We intend to place containers in various businesses around town, similar to the Lions club's eyeglass collection containers. Naturally, we need to find frequently visited businesses, like grocery and drug stores, banks, etc.

We also need to approach area businesses that use these products about collecting their cartridges.
