Among the highlights: The 2004 cost of living adjustment was 2.1%, the upper limit on income to get full payments is now \$31,080, the Medicare Part B premium is increasing, more services can be handled over the internet, the new (and confusing) Prescription Drug Coverage is on the way, with several cards to choose from, and while there is a 1.5 trillion surplus on hand now, by 2015 that will be gone as more baby boomers retire and start collecting benefits.
