Citizens for Bettering A Community

Bruce Monson spoke to the club, representing Citizens for Bettering a Community (CBC). CBC advocates a yes vote on the two referenda on the Janesville ballot on April 6th. CBC believes it is time to expand the number or elected representatives on the city council, to elect them from aldermanic districts, rather than at large, and to replace the city manager as CEO of the city with an elected mayor. Bruce said that the organization believes that the city should employ a professional administrator to run the day to day operations of the city. The mayor would be out in the community, seeking citizen input on what local government should be doing.

Bruce said he doesn't believe that representation tied to aldermanic districts would be more political than the present system. Asked what salary would be paid to the mayor, he said that it is not established in the proposed charter ordinance, and would be established by the council.

He guessed that it would be somewhere around \$65,000, and the cost would be offset by a lower salary for the administrator than is currently paid to the city manager, along with the elimination of the assistant city manager position.

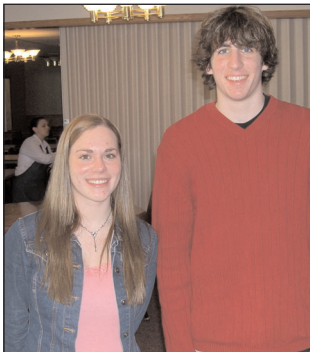
